Tres Volcanes Neighborhood Association is aware of many concerns raised by a significant number of neighbors about the Albuquerque Public Schools proposed stadium and sports complex being developed at the current proposed site of 98th Street/Arroyo Vista and supports, in accordance with the March 9, 2011 Resolution A, that the site at Double Eagle II Roadway/Paseo Del Volcan would better serve the City of Albuquerque and align with the Westland Master Plan (see attached Resolution A).
